HB 5412: Community Health Worker (CHW) Bill Sponsors: Representatives Gabel – Hernandez – Welch – Lilly – Golar

A Community Health Worker is:

- Frontline public health worker with close understanding of the community served.
- Liaison between health, social and other non-clinical services and the community.
- Culturally and linguistically competent individual.

Effectiveness of CHWs:

- Integration of CHW services within health care delivery systems is linked to reductions in chronic illness, increased medication adherence, increased patient participation, enhanced overall community health, and reduced health care costs.¹
- CHW outreach programs have been found to have a return on investment of more than \$2.00 for every dollar spent.²

<u>HB 5412:</u>

- **HB 5412** would codify the American Public Health Association (APHA) definition and establish the necessary infrastructure to promote the recognition and integration of CHWs into the workforce.
- Establishes the scope of practice and core competencies of a CHW.
- Creates the **Illinois Community Health Worker Advisory Board**, the majority of which will be CHWs, to advise the Department of Public Health, the Governor, and the General Assembly on:
 - Training and certification processes, best practices and processes, and investigating reimbursement options.
- Certification can create a pathway for CHWs to have stable jobs.
- **Does not** establish a requirement of state certification or reimbursement for CHWs, nor does it permit CHWs to act in any capacity requiring professional certification or licensure.
