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Free GED/HSE and English as a Second Language Classes Offered Through South Suburban College in South Holland, Oak Forest and Riverdale

Many adults choose to pursue a high school education through the High School Equivalency (GED/HSE) program. The HSE program will develop the skills required to pass the High School Equivalency exams. - UNDER AGE 18 - WITHDRAWAL FORM FROM THE HIGH SCHOOL OF CURRENT RESIDENCE
- PROOF OF SOCIAL SECURITY NUMBER (GED/HSE only)

Priority registration is given to continuing students who are making progress in their studies. Waiting lists will be taken as classes have a maximum number of students who can be served. (Indiana Residents cannot participate in this program.)
